


Blessed Beyond Capacity

WE MUST enlarge our borders. Since God so wonderfully helped us to liquidate an indebtedness of approximately \$93,000.00 two years ago, students have come to us in such numbers that we are unable to accommodate them properly. Indeed God has blessed us beyond capacity. Two alternatives lie before us—EXPAND or RESTRICT. To restrict or limit the many young people who desire to enroll at NORTHWEST NAZARENE COLLEGE would be disastrous. This does not seem to be God's plan. If He has called them to prepare, He has called us to provide and will help us do so. Therefore we must follow Divine leadership and ENLARGE.

THE NEED

1. The present *Chapel* is over-crowded. A score of students are forced to sit on the platform. We are so cramped that it is difficult and well nigh impossible to do efficient altar work.
2. Our *Chapel-Auditorium* is so small that our students alone fill it to capacity so that we cannot freely invite visitors to our chapel services or literary programs.
3. The *College Library* seats only 62 persons. There are 135 college students alone who need to use the Library to say nothing of students enrolled in the Bible College, School of Music, and High School. At the evening study hours it is impossible to seat anywhere near all who desire places and they are forced to leave the Library and go to class rooms.
4. *Classrooms* are too few and many are too small.
5. *Science Laboratories* are too limited. To illustrate: the Freshman Chemistry Class has nearly 35 enrolled with only 25 places at tables.
6. To secure *Full Accrediting* we must provide more adequate facilities.
7. To do the larger work God has for us as an institution we must arise and enlarge. Remember "The Greater Northwest Nazarene College, the greater the number of workers for the Kingdom of Heaven." We must not fail.

PRESENT BUILDING

1. Only 10 Classrooms. Too few.
2. Inadequate Science Laboratories.
3. Chapel seating only 249. Excessive.
4. Library accommodates only 62 persons to say nothing of students enrolled in the Bible College, School of Music, and High School.
5. Building entirely of frame construction.
6. Executive and Business Office.


THE COST


