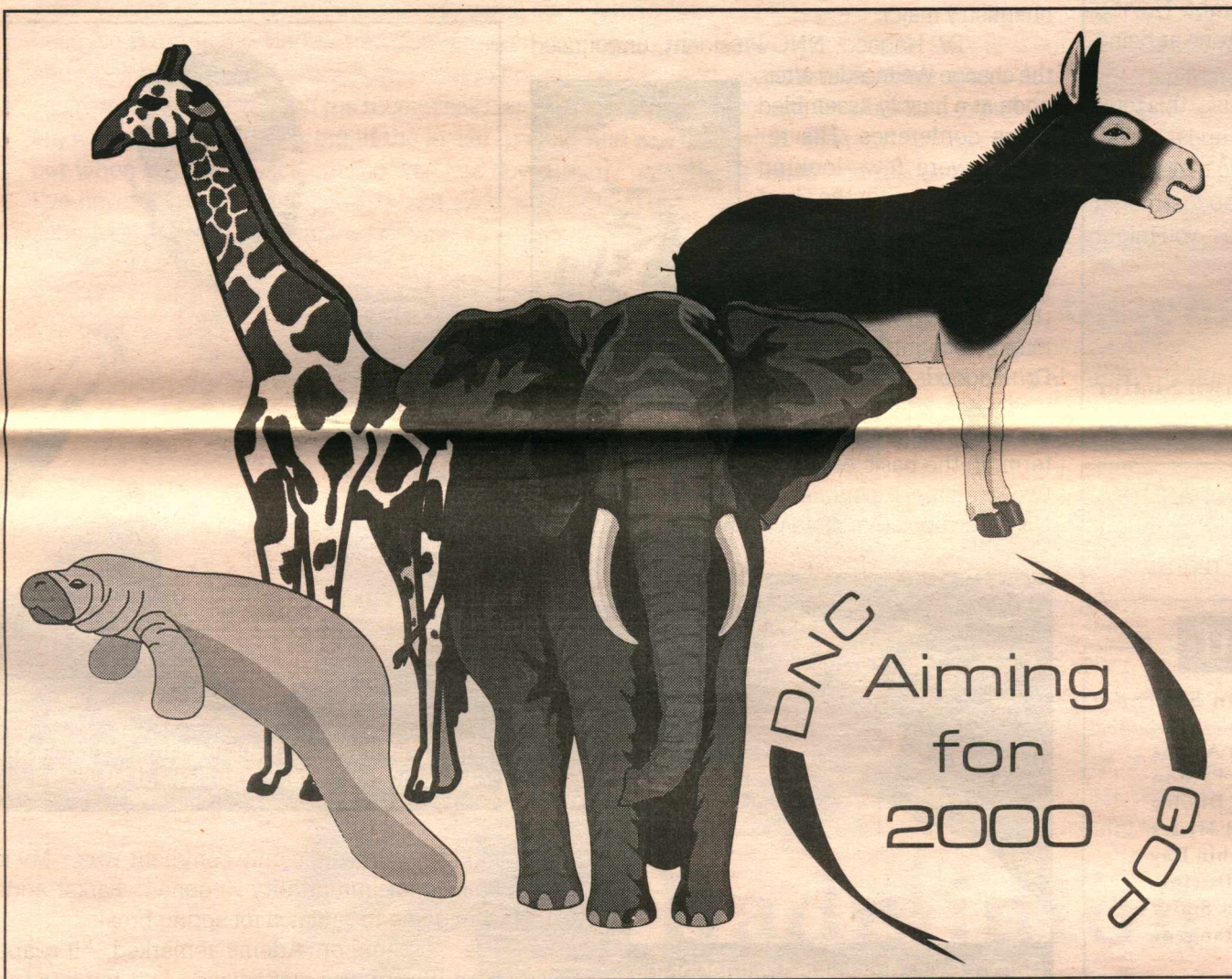

Student sues, NNC settles big

At the regent's chapel on March 13, it was announced that the new dorm would be dubbed Gilbert Ford Hall after the retired physics professor and long-time supporter of this college. Ford had been involved in many areas of NNC, making himself a very respectable name in the opinion of faculty, staff and clergy all over the Nazarene church. He eventually ended his career here at NNC as acting president after the death of president Leon Doane.

This spring break has, however, seen a lot happen. In response to the fastest decision made by an American court of law, Barry Lewis Hall was made the name to adorn the facade of NNC's newest building. This new nomenclature comes from senior Barry Lewis who is currently a Biochemistry major.

Dr. Hagood, NNC President, announced the change Wednesday afternoon at a hastily assembled press conference. His remarks were few; looking very haggard after the short but exhausting trial. "We are disappointed it had to come to this. Dr. Ford's service to the institution deserved longer recognition," stated Dr. Hagood. This decision was made after Lewis sued

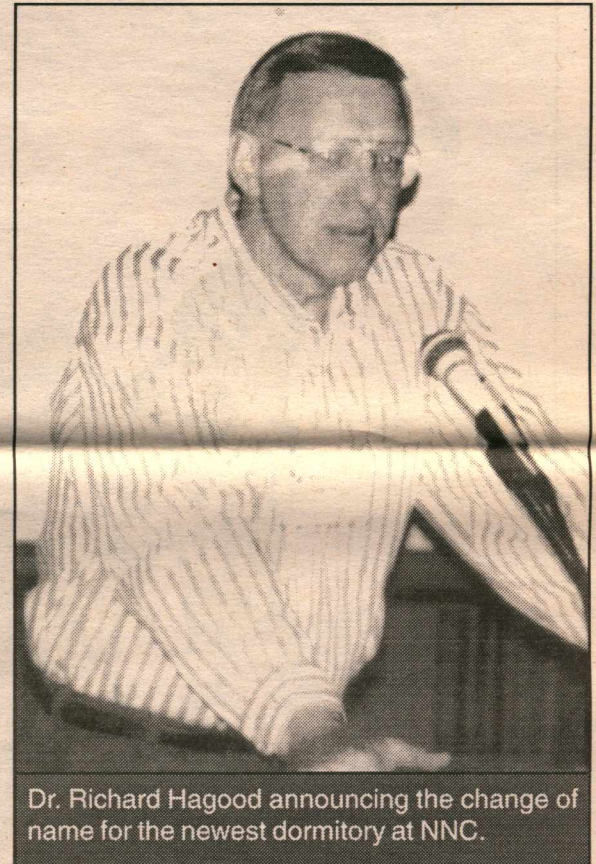

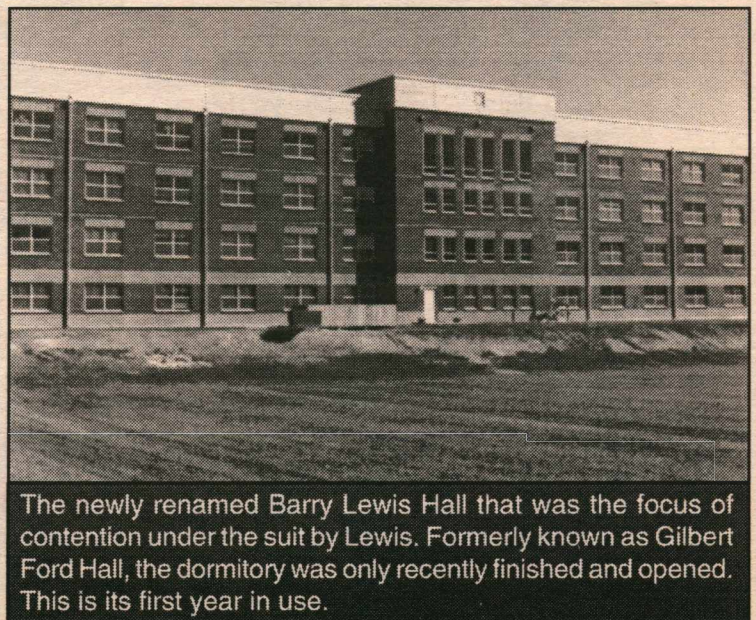
Dr. Richard Hagood announcing the change of name for the newest dormitory at NNC.

members of an eight piece orchestra were seen appreciating the "fresh" air out behind the lodge. 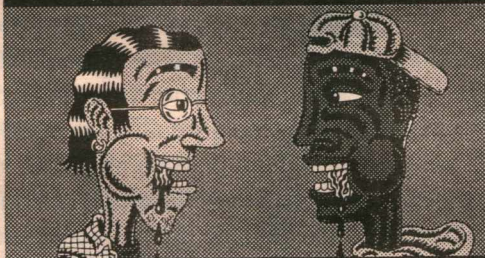

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Titanic remains possibly raised

New York, NY— It has recently been proposed by the R.M.S. Titanic Inc. that the Titanic be raised from its watery grave of the North Atlantic. After 86 years of being submerged, people want to know just exactly what this Titanic now looks like.

Many plans are in the air of what should be done with the Titanic once it has been resurfaced. One idea was to build a storage room to hold the remains of the ship. There, walkways and glass tunnels would be constructed so that people could tour the boat and view it as it now is.

One employee of the R.M.S. Titanic Inc. was reported to have said, "I feel this would be a great opportunity for many people of the world to see. Full plans are expected to come out within the next few months. Major decisions should be reached as to whether the Titanic will remain at the bottom of the North Atlantic or be raised and restored for public viewing in a museum somewhere in the U.S.

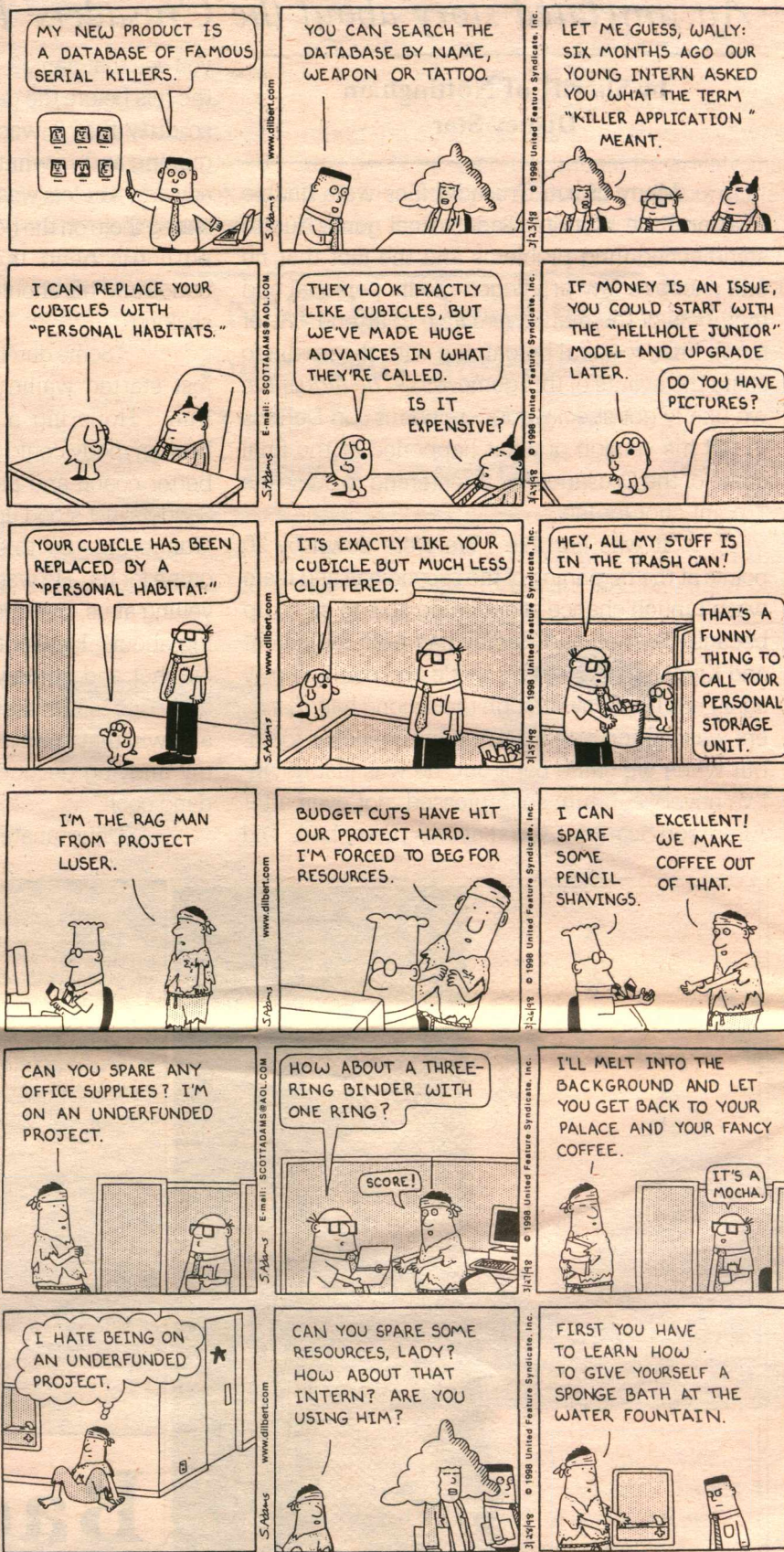
